#### Call to Worship

- One: Another year has gone by, and we kept waiting for things to return to normal.
- Many: This year we do find ourselves close to normal, but still not quite there yet. We may worship at church or at home in our jammies, but we still are able to find the time to worship together tonight.
- One: It would have been easy to have opted out of worship tonight. It would have been understandable to be a no-show. The weather can be challenging and everything can still be too hard, too painful, too different, too complicated to be present on this night.
- Many: But we come from a long tradition of showing up the star, the angels, Joseph and Mary each in their own way, Elizabeth, the shepherds, the magi. They all showed up even though the night wasn't what they thought, or hoped it would be.
- One: Dear ones, lean in and listen closely.
  Let this night be what it is, instead of what it is not.
  Let us celebrate the birth of Jesus.
  For indeed, we have everything we need open hearts, joyful spirits, and a light that will shine into all our tomorrows. Come, let us worship the newborn King.
- Many: Let us give thanks and worship the babe laying in the manger.

# Lighting of the Christ Candle

- One: On this cold night, we warmly gather to bear witness to the light of Christ with all the faithful of every time and place:
- Many: Like Isaiah, Jeremiah, and the prophets of Israel, we await the coming salvation of the Lord, and look for the coming of the One who will bring justice and righteousness to the earth.

The first candle, the light of Hope, is lit.

One: With John the Baptist, calling from the wilderness, we cry: "Prepare the way of the Lord!" Many: "Repent for the kingdom of heaven has come near."

The second candle, the light of Peace, is lit.

One: With Mary, the mother of Jesus, we magnify the Lord, rejoicing in God our Savior, Many: Remembering that "the Mighty One has done great things for us, and holy is God's name."

The third candle, the light of Joy, is lit.

One: With the writers of the gospels, Matthew, Mark, Luke and John, we tell the good news Many: We tell the story of Jesus, the child of Bethlehem born in a barn, yet came to save us and is coming again to rule in glory.

The fourth candle, the light of Love, is lit.

One: With choirs of angels, and with the entire heavenly host, we sing:

Many: "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth, peace and goodwill to all."

The Christ candle in the center is lit.

All: The Word became flesh and lived among us, full of grace and truth, and we have seen his glory! Alleluia!

#### Luke 2: 1-20 The Birth of Jesus

In those days Caesar Augustus issued a decree that a census should be taken of the entire Roman world. (This was the first census that took place while Quirinius was governor of Syria.) And everyone went to their own town to register. So Joseph also went up from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to Bethlehem the town of David, because he belonged to the house and line of David.

He went there to register with Mary, who was pledged to be married to him and was expecting a child. While they were there, the time came for the baby to be born, and she gave birth to her firstborn, a son. She wrapped him in cloths and placed him in a manger, because there was no guest room available for them.

And there were shepherds living out in the fields nearby, keeping watch over their flocks at night. An angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid. I bring you good news that will cause great joy for all the people. Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you; he is the Messiah, the Lord. This will be a sign to you: You will find a baby wrapped in cloths and lying in a manger." Suddenly a great company of the heavenly host appeared with the angel, praising God and saying,

"Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace, goodwill among people."

When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let's go to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened, which the Lord has told us about." So they hurried off and found Mary and Joseph, and the baby, who was lying in the manger. So, whether you join us regularly, are here for the first time, or fall somewhere in between, remember that no matter who you are, or where you are on life's journey, you are welcome here to Christ's table of extravagant welcome and Grace.

#### The Great Prayer of Thanksgiving

#### Adapted from Rev. Thom Shuman

One: May the God of silent nights be with you! Many: And also with you.

One: Open your hearts to the One born in the little town of Bethlehem.

#### Many: May Emmanuel come to abide in our hearts.

One: Tonight, join with all in singing of our joy this night.

- Many: May our voices blend with those of the angels and shepherds who have gone before us, and with those gathered here tonight.
- One: We are gathered here tonight from many different places, yet we gather around this open table of abundant joy and amazing grace.
- One: Let us pray
- Many: Gracious God, pour out your Holy Spirit upon us and upon these your gifts, that the bread we break and the cup we bless may be true communion with you. By your Spirit make us one with Christ that we may be one with all who share this feast. Give us courage to speak his truth, to seek his justice, and to love others, as He loved us. We ask these things in the name of Jesus who taught us to pray, saying...

The Lord's Prayer (debts/debtors)

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy Name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done, On earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever. Amen.

#### Words of Institution

One: We gather tonight to celebrate the birth of Jesus. It is only fitting that we also remember his sacrifice as well. On the night on which he was betrayed by a friend, our Lord Jesus took bread, and after giving thanks, he broke it and gave it to his disciples, saying, "Take, and eat. This bread is my body, given for you. Do this remembering me."

(Please take what you are using for the bread of life and hold it up)

One: The body of Christ, broken for you, take and eat.

And in the same manner, he also took the cup after supper, saying, "This cup is the new covenant, sealed in my blood, given for the forgiveness of sin. Drink from it, all of you. Do this remembering me."

(Please take what you are using for the cup of salvation and hold it up)

The cup of Salvation, poured out for you, take and drink

One: Let us pray...

- Many: As we have been fed by the bread, may we be strengthened to go and bring tangible hope to all who are famished by despair. As we have drank from grace's cup, may it nourish us, so we may go to overflow with love and peace for everyone we meet in every season. Amen.
- One: When we begin to sing Silent Night, the ushers will begin to pass around the light of Christ. As you pass the light of Christ please tip the unlit candle toward the lit one as you light your candle to avoid dripping hot wax. Adults are asked to assist any children with their glow sticks for safety. When your candle is lit and you have passed the light along to the next person, please continue to sing Silent Night.
