Scripture Readings for Today 1 Corinthians 13

13 If I speak in the tongues of men or of angels, but do not have love, I am only a resounding gong or a clanging cymbal. ² If I have the gift of prophecy and can fathom all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have a faith that can move mountains, but do not have love, I am nothing. ³ If I give all I possess to the poor and give over my body to hardship that I may boast, but do not have love, I gain nothing.

⁴ Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. ⁵ It does not dishonor others, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs. ⁶ Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth. ⁷ It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres.

⁸ Love never fails. But where there are prophecies, they will cease; where there are tongues, they will be stilled; where there is knowledge, it will pass away. ⁹ For we know in part and we prophesy in part, ¹⁰ but when completeness comes, what is in part disappears. ¹¹ When I was a child, I talked like a child, I thought like a child, I reasoned like a child. When I became a man, I put the ways of childhood behind me. ¹² For now we see only a reflection as in a mirror; then we shall see face to face. Now I know in part; then I shall know fully, even as I am fully known.

¹³ And now these three remain: faith, hope and love. But the greatest of these is love.

Invitation to the Table

One: Christ invites us here. This meal is what connects us to that river of living water and the tree of life that never lacks food for bellies or shade for peaceful rest. No matter who you are, or where you are on life's journey, you are invited to Christ's table of extravagant welcome

Many: O let us taste and see the goodness of the God who calls us to the table and meets us in every feast!

Great Prayer of Thanksgiving

One: May the God of love be with you.

Many: And also with you.

One: Do not be afraid to offer your hearts to God.

Many: We do so, knowing they will be filled with God's love.

One: Always and forever, let us praise our God.

Many: Here, now, every day, everywhere, we will offer our songs to the One who abides.

One: Empowered with your words, prophets came to remind us of what would happen, but because we loved sin and death more, and we gained nothing from their advice. So you gave us the priceless treasure of your heart who, filled with your love, handed over his body so we might gain everything.

With those who worry they cannot do what you ask, with those who believe your word is fulfilled, we join our voices in singing your praises:

Many: Holy, holy, holy are you, God of abiding faith.

All creation sings of its hope in you.

One: Jesus showed us love in so many ways.

He never blew his own horn or wished he was someone else;

he never bullied the vulnerable, didn't whine, and let go of every grudge.

He didn't look the other way when we were foolish, and encouraged everyone to own up to their mistakes.

He picked up all of our burdens, he trusted everyone the world discounts,

he looked beyond all our fears, as well as his own, taking on everything sin and death had to offer him in order that everyone might experience your resurrection love.

We may not have prophetic powers,

we may not know as much as we think we do, but we can speak of that mystery of faith:

Many: God's Word came, offering his life in faith on the cross.

God's Word will come, bringing love for each one of God's children.

One: Your love has never retired, Eternal God, but your Spirit pours it out upon the gifts of the Table and those gathered around it. This bread, though broken, will feed us so we might be able to bear the brokenness of those around us, believe in all those doubted by the world. The cup, containing faith, hope, and love, will send us into the world, to serve in the belief that justice has no future; to endure until peace becomes the reality rather than the fantasy of a few. By your Spirit unite us with the living Christ and with all who follow in his name, that we may be one in ministry in every time and place. As this bread is Christ's body for us, help us to be the body of Christ in the world. Let us, as the body of Christ, pause to lift up those in need of our prayers this morning...

Prayers of intercession may be offered here.

One: Help us, O God, to love as Christ loved. Knowing our own weaknesses, may we stand with all who stumble. Sharing in his suffering, may we remember all who suffer. Held in his love, may we embrace all whom the world denies. Rejoicing in his forgiveness, may we forgive all who sin against us. And when the past is finally behind us and we are gathered in the new Jerusalem with our sisters and brothers of every time and place, we will join our hands around your feast, and sing your praises from the depths of our hearts, We ask these things, both spoken and unspoken, in the name of Jesus who taught us to pray

The Lord's Prayer (debts/debtors)

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy Name.

One: On the night on which he was betrayed, our Lord Jesus took bread, and after giving thanks, he broke it and gave it to his disciples, saying, "Take, eat. This bread is my body, given for you. Do this remembering me."

And in the same manner, he also took the cup after supper, saying, "This cup is the new covenant, sealed in my blood, given for the forgiveness of sin. Drink from it, all of you. Do this remembering me."

The Communion of the People

(Please take what you are using for the bread of life and hold it up)

The body of Christ, broken for you, take and eat.

(Please take what you are using for the cup of salvation and hold it up)

The cup of Salvation, poured out for you, take and drink.
