Scripture Reading 2 Corinthians 6:1-10 NIV

6 As God's co-workers we urge you not to receive God's grace in vain. 2 For he says,

"In the time of my favor I heard you, and in the day of salvation I helped you." [a]

I tell you, now is the time of God's favor, now is the day of salvation.

3 We put no stumbling block in anyone's path, so that our ministry will not be discredited. 4 Rather, as servants of God we commend ourselves in every way: in great endurance; in troubles, hardships and distresses; 5 in beatings, imprisonments and riots; in hard work, sleepless nights and hunger; 6 in purity, understanding, patience and kindness; in the Holy Spirit and in sincere love; 7 in truthful speech and in the power of God; with weapons of righteousness in the right hand and in the left; 8 through glory and dishonor, bad report and good report; genuine, yet regarded as impostors; 9 known, yet regarded as unknown; dying, and yet we live on; beaten, and yet not killed; 10 sorrowful, yet always rejoicing; poor, yet making many rich; having nothing, and yet possessing everything.

A Time for Reflection

Invitation to the Observance of the Lenten Discipline

One: Friends in Christ, the season of Lent is a time to prepare ourselves to celebrate the redemption won for us through the sacrificial mystery of the death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. We begin this holy season by acknowledging our need for repentance, and for the mercy and forgiveness proclaimed in the gospel of Jesus Christ.

We begin our journey to Easter with the sign of ashes. This ancient sign speaks of the frailty and uncertainty of human life, and marks the atonement for all our sins and all our shortcomings in this community of faith.

I invite you, therefore, in the name of Christ, to observe a holy Lent by self-examination and penitence, by prayer and fasting, forgiving and forgetting, by works of love, and by reading and meditating on the Word of God.

Let us bow before God, our Creator and Redeemer, and confess our sin.

Psalm of Repentance

Psalm 51:1-17

One: Have mercy on me, O God, according to your loving-kindness; in your great compassion blot out my

offenses.

Many: Wash me through and through from my wickedness and cleanse me from my sin.

One: For I know my transgressions, and my sin is ever before me.

Many: Against you only have I sinned and done what is evil in your sight.

One: And so you are justified when you speak and upright in your judgment.

Many: Indeed, I have strayed from Your path since my birth, yet still seek you out

One: For behold, you look for truth deep within me, and will make me understand wisdom secretly.

Many: Purge me from my sin, and I shall be pure; wash me, and I shall be clean indeed.

One: Make me hear of joy and gladness, that the body you have broken may rejoice.

Many: Hide your face from my sins and blot out all my iniquities.

One: Create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a right spirit within me.

Many: Cast me not away from your presence and take not your holy Spirit from me.

One: Give me the joy of your saving help again and sustain me with your bountiful Spirit.

Many: I shall teach your ways to the wicked, and sinners shall return to you.

One: Deliver me from death, O God, and my tongue shall sing of your righteousness, O God of my salvation.

Many: Open my lips, O Lord, and my mouth shall proclaim your praise.

One: Had you desired it, I would have offered sacrifice, but you take no delight in burnt-offerings.

Many: The sacrifice of God is a troubled spirit; a broken and contrite heart, O God, you will not despise.

Prayer of Penitence

One: Just as new growth surely follows the fire so new things await us as we make this journey to repentance.

Because we have covered ourselves with pride and arrogance:

Many: Cleanse us and set us free.

One: Since we have been content with the empty and the superficial:

Many: Fill us from the depths of love.

One: When we become trapped in old patterns and struggles:

Many: Lift our eyes in hope.

One: Even though we are broken and far short of perfection:

Many: Form us for loving service.

One: After our best efforts have met with rejection and discouragement:

Many: Encourage us still to trust.

One: So we bring before God all that is in our life, knowing that we can hold nothing back from the fire of love

which consumes even those faults which we dearly cherish and trusting that God will surely fulfill the

promise of newness within our life.

Many: Amen.

Imposition of Ashes

One: Let us Pray. Almighty God, you have created us out of the dust of the earth. May these ashes be for us a

sign of our mortality and penitence, and a reminder that only by your gracious gift are we given everlasting

life; through Jesus Christ our Savior.

Many: Amen.

*Imposition of the Ashes

Please pause, and take a few moments for prayer, asking God to show you what you need to forgive and for what you need to be forgiven this Lent, what you need to give up and what you need to take on in your life.

As the Pastor signs your forehead with the ashes, they will say these or similar words: "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return."

When everyone who wishes to receive ashes has done so, we will continue in prayer.

One: Accomplish in us, O God, the work of your salvation, Many: That we may show forth your glory in the world.

One: By the cross and passion of our Savior,

Many: Bring us with all your saints to the joy of Christ's resurrection. Amen.
